

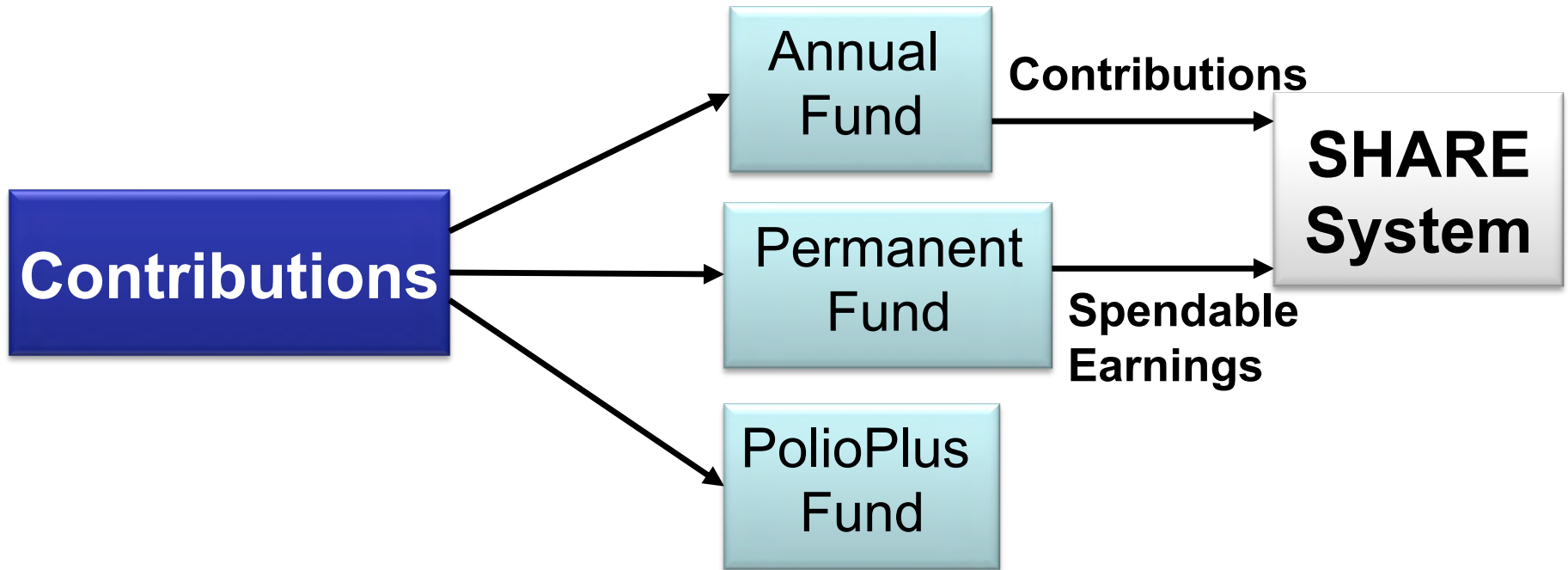

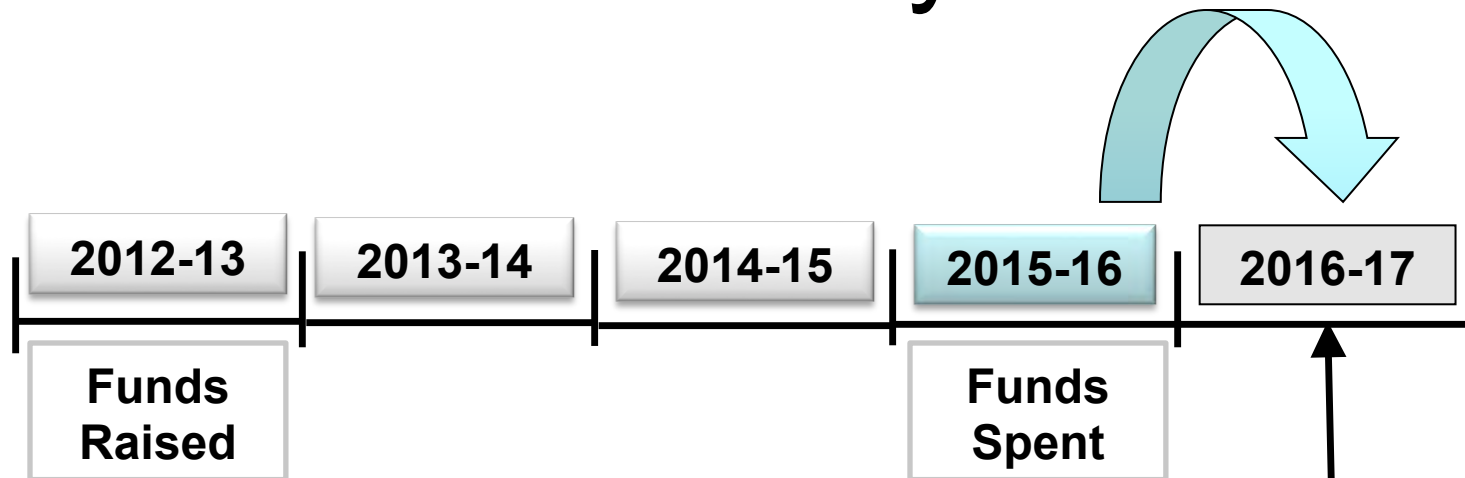

District Grants

- Can be local or overseas projects
- Sustainable
- Support the areas of focus
- Be submitted in accordance with the District Grants Terms & Conditions



Qualification

- Qualification provides clubs with financial and stewardship controls for meeting District and Foundation requirements and managing grant-funded activities
- Clubs need to qualify before applying for district grants



Club Memorandum of Understanding

- The club MOU is a binding agreement between the club and its district, outlining Foundation requirements.
- By signing the MOU, the club agrees to comply with the requirements.

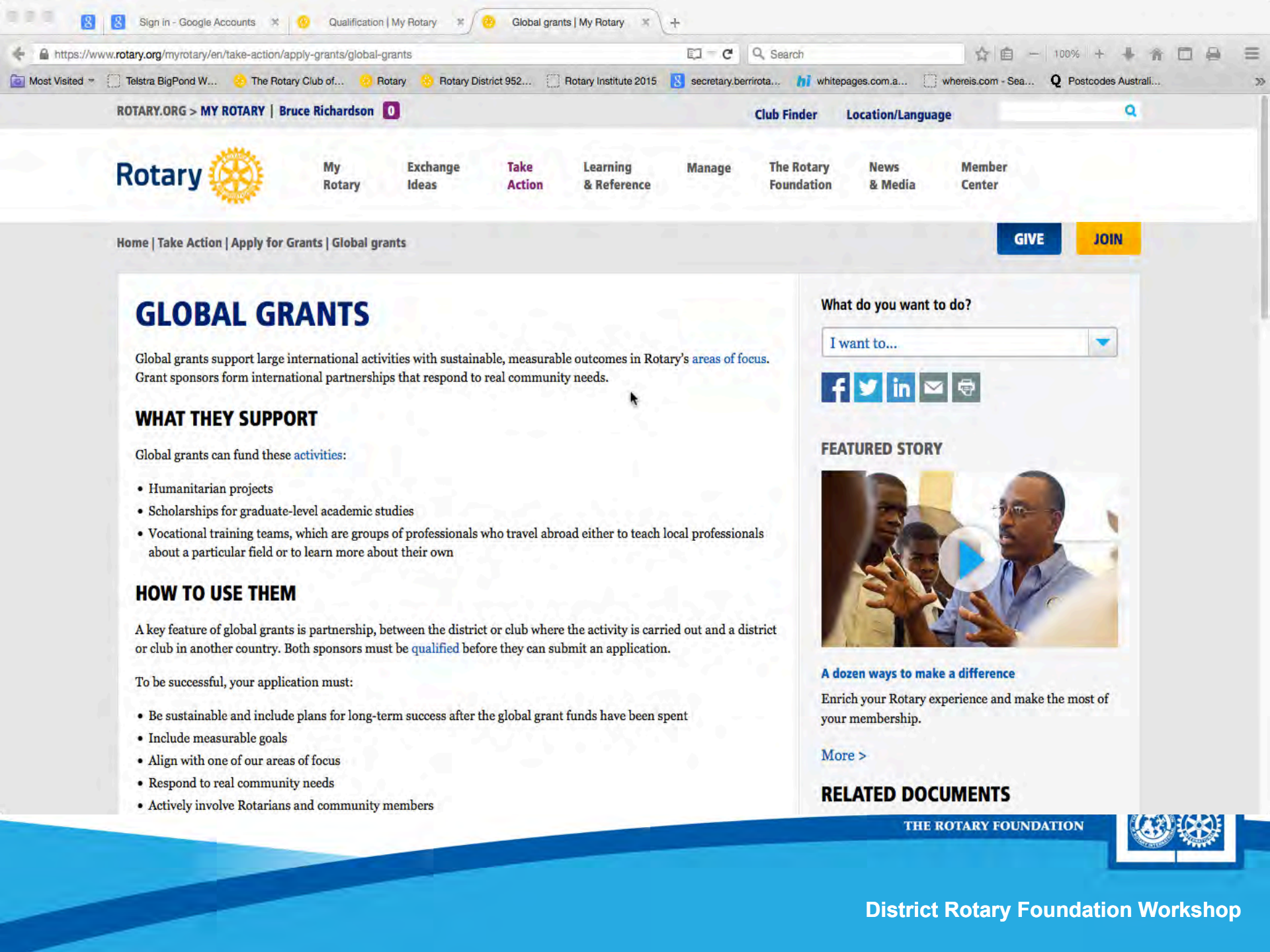

GLOBAL GRANTS

Global grants support large international activities with sustainable, measurable outcomes in Rotary's [areas of focus](#). Grant sponsors form international partnerships that respond to real community needs.

WHAT THEY SUPPORT

Global grants can fund these [activities](#):

- Humanitarian projects
- Scholarships for graduate-level academic studies
- Vocational training teams, which are groups of professionals who travel abroad either to teach local professionals about a particular field or to learn more about their own

HOW TO USE THEM

A key feature of global grants is partnership, between the district or club where the activity is carried out and a district or club in another country. Both sponsors must be [qualified](#) before they can submit an application.

To be successful, your application must:

- Be sustainable and include plans for long-term success after the global grant funds have been spent
- Include measurable goals
- Align with one of our areas of focus
- Respond to real community needs
- Actively involve Rotarians and community members

Stewardship

Stewardship is the responsible management and oversight of grant funds, which ensures that funds are used properly and benefit populations in need.

Stewardship Practices

- Have Rotarians supervise project
- Implement projects as approved
- Follow standard business practice
- Report irregularities
- Submit reports
- Retain documents

- Investigating allegations

Qualification

- Qualification provides clubs with financial and stewardship controls for meeting Foundation requirements and managing grant-funded activities.
- Clubs need to qualify before applying for global and packaged grants.



Qualification Requirements

- Must attend a grant management workshop
- Read, sign, and submit club MOU to the district



Grant Management Workshops

- *Grant Management Workshops are held on a “one to one” basis for each club when they are planning to commence a Global Grant project*

Application Process

1. Club qualifies
2. Club submits club-developed global grant proposal online
3. TRF reviews proposal for initial approval
4. Club submits global grant application
5. District approves online
6. TRF reviews for final approval

Here's how you can get involved:

District Qualification

Before applying for grants, district officers agree to implement the financial and stewardship requirements in the memorandum of understanding (MOU) by completing the online qualification process.

District Grants

District grants are block grants that allow clubs and districts to address immediate needs in their communities and abroad.

Global Grants

Global grants, which range from US\$15,000 to US\$200,000, fund large international humanitarian projects, vocational training teams, and scholarships that have sustainable, measurable outcomes in one or more of the areas of focus.

Packaged Grants

Packaged grants allow clubs and districts to work with Rotary's strategic partners to implement pre-designed projects.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION



Global Grant Reporting

- Progress report submitted 12 months after funds received
- Every 12 months until project is complete
- Final report submitted within 2 months of project completion
